From the Hand of Dan

When I lived in New Orleans, I served in extension ministries as a chaplain for a large hospice there. The hospice I worked with didn't have a residence like some do. Some hospices have a home where people move into and live. The hospice I worked with didn't do that. People stayed in their own homes and were visited routinely by nurses, social workers, aides, housekeepers, and me, your loveable old chaplain Dan.

Because our hospice served people throughout southeastern Louisiana, this involved a great deal of driving from home to home. I would spend a good deal of my day simply driving from one patient to the next.

The most frustrating period of the year for me was during Mardi Gras season - and yes, it's referred to as a season in New Orleans. From Epiphany to Ash Wednesday, parades fill the streets. New Orleans is already famous for their habit of throwing a parade at the drop of a hat, but during the winter months of "Mardi Gras Season", it becomes almost unbearable! It's not that I'm a stick in the mud or an old fuddy duddy, either, it's that I need to get across that street and there's a parade in the way!

Mardi Gras itself is a day set aside for cleaning the house. Many people make Lenten sacrifices of sugars or sweets or coffee or what have you, Mardi Gras - French for Fat Tuesday - is a last-ditch effort to get rid of all the goodies so that they don't tempt you during Lent. In fact, it's traditional on Mardi Gras to eat pancakes, to use up all the eggs and sweet flour. Mardi Gras is an important part of the faith journey for many people, and I get that; I understand the reasoning behind it. But I need to get across the street and there's a parade in the way!! Mardi Gras this year is on Feb. 25, which is remarkably late That means Easter will be late, too - clear up and gone in the middle of April! It all has to do with the lunar cycles. I look forward to spending Lent with you in the coming weeks. Lent is a time to contemplate our mutual humanity, how we are all finite creatures worshipping the infinite Creator. I look forward to sharing in these reflections with you.

Just please don't throw a parade in the middle of the street I need to cross!

Salvation Army Bell Ringing

We want to give a BIG thank you to the faithful who rang the bell for Salvation Army this past Christmas Season! Awesome job! We raised \$2539.63 with our bell ringing. The monies raised will be used to help people in Newton County. Most often the people who come to us for help are in need of funds to pay utilities, rent, or to buy gas for their vehicle or they might need a place to stay. Still others might need help with medication or otherwise. When people call for help we tell them to come to the church during office hours Mon.-Fri. 9-12. Since our Salvation Army funds are limited we try to spread them out over the year and we limit our assistance mostly to \$50.00 per instance. If funds are available we allow people to get help from the Salvation Army funds once every six

In addition to the Salvation Army funds, the church also has our own 'emergency fund'. The loose offering from each first Sunday of the month is used for it. This fund is used in addition to the Salvation Army fund with similar restrictions. When people ask the church for food, we refer them to the CFC food pantry which is open every first and third Monday of the month.

KTUMC is required to file a financial report with the Indiana Conference summarizing all account balances each May. The Audit Committee will return your books as soon as possible.

2019 Trinity Giving Summary

Happy New Year! The Finance Committee would like to say thank you for your generosity in support of Trinity's ministries this past year. Trinity was greatly blessed by your gifts in 2019!

In the General Fund account, all income totaled \$143,543 which was \$1,646 less than our expenses in 2019. This income total is an increase of 4.9% from our General Fund income in 2018. God is good!

In the Capital account, gifts were \$4,538 in 2019, which was \$20,973 less than 2018. This was below our annual total mortgage payment of \$13,248. 2019 was not a typical year for our Capital account support, so we believe this year the Capital account giving will be more representative of our loving congregation.

Our mortgage balance is currently \$189,704, and our Endowment Fund balance is \$381,499. What an extraordinary family we have here at Trinity! 2020 is going to be a blessed year in the life of our congregation...and our community!
